On February 11th, the Breakfast speaker will be Dom Amyotte of Graycon. Dom will be speaking on network access controls.

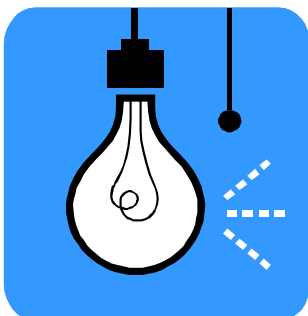

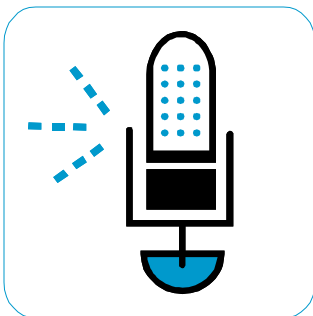
