### **Speaker Profile**

Barry joined the Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games (VANOC) in October 2005. Barry draws on a comprehensive background in technology most recently in senior management roles with HSBC where he managed Information Security in Canada and in 2002 received the President's Council Award for outstanding achievement. In 2003 Barry led the Infrastructure Security team of the North American technology infrastructure where he played a key role in developing the global strategy for security applications and was involved in supporting numerous global business projects and systems. In January, 2006, Barry was seconded to the Torino Organizing Committee and the Atos Origin Information Security teams to gain firsthand experience of the Olympic security challenges and learn from these outstanding teams that assisted in staging the 2006 Winter Games.

### **Presentation Overview**

In 2010, Vancouver, Whistler and Canada will play host to over 80 countries and 10,000 accredited media while staging events for approximately 2,500 athletes at 11 competition venues. These events will be broadcast to billions of viewers and attended by tens of thousands of spectators with the assistance of 25,000 volunteers. The 2010 Winter Games present special challenges from a technology and information security perspective. Leading up to the Games, over 80 business applications, 5,300 workstations, 550 servers, 700 printers, hundreds of kilometres of cabling and a large number of power systems will be deployed. The Technology team of VANOC in conjunction with its partners must deliver this technology in a secure and seamless way. You won't want to miss this engaging and informative presentation that will review the technology of the Games, the approach to Information Security, and the challenges that lay ahead.
